Leanne Sanderson as Eva Cassidy and JD Adams, the 2004 Search for a Star winner, kept up the tempo for Phil Fryer to then wow the audience looking and sounding more like Frank Sinatra than the great man himself!

Santa made a welcome appearance and distributed sticks of rock to the crowd, which by then was tightly packed. The afternoon's entertainment concluded with several songs from the new singing sensation '52 Week High' and a guest appearance by Jayne Tunnicliffe (Coronation Street's Yana Lumb). The traditional countdown to the switch on was concluded by a spontaneous snowfall on Manor Street that gave a real festive feel to an event that has developed into a not to be missed event in the calendar.

The Old Town's annual Street Festival, already a very popular event, promised to be even more spectacular this year! Under newly installed lighting the event attracted all the usual stalls, and Victorian children's rides, together with a Hog Roast, Street organ and - new for this year - a fully functioning stage with six local primary schools singing, acting and dancing. The Festival was opened by Sleeping Beauty and her supporters from the Spa's panto cast and the Mayor was there to switch on the Christmas tree lights and judge a children's Fancy Dress competition. The Festival culminated in a lantern-lit carol-singing procession to Church Green, led by the Priory choirboys. The Priory then held a Choral Society evening in the church to add to the attractions and round off the evening.
