Council Year 2016 - 2017

The Council year commenced with only one person being nominated to be the Mayor of Bridlington and Councillor Liam Dealtry was voted in and his Mayoress for the year was wife Mrs Michelle Dealtry. The chosen Mayor's charities this year are the Royal British Legion Alderson House, Humberside & South Yorkshire Army Cadet Force Bridlington Detachment, Bridlington 252 Squadron Air Training Corps and the Sea Cadet Unit Bridlington. There were two nominations for the position of Deputy Mayor, Councillor Malcolm Milns and Councillor Marsburg. When put to the vote Councillor Malcolm Milns took it with a majority show of hands and he declared that his wife Councillor Thelma Milns is his Deputy Mayoress for the year.

The Council Committee Memberships and the Outside Posts and Responsibilities were decided at the First Council's business meeting in May. Following first meetings of the committees Councillor Glenn Holmes became the Chair of the Planning & Environmental Committee, Councillor Thelma Milns became the Chair of the Finance & General Purposes, Councillor Shelagh Finlay became the Chair of the Newsletter Committee & Councillor Liam Dealtry became the Chair of the Staffing Committee.

During the month of June the Council renewed the Five Year Events Licence with the East Riding of Yorkshire Council (ERYC) for the authority to make use of King Street and Garrison Square for events. A bin request was approved and ordered for St Aidan Road near the snicket to Priory Crescent. The Council's Aims and Objectives were considered and no changes were made at that time but with a resolution that they would be reviewed again at a later date. At the Full Council meeting in June the Council were briefed about the cutting of the Hospital Shuttle bus Service due to the financial issues by Mr Simon Cox, Chief Officer from Scarborough & Ryedale Clinical Commissioning Group and Mr David Boden, Transport Manager from ERYC. Before culling the Service entirely the ERYC Transport Manager wished to propose a trial "Paid for Service" with a view to the Service being given the opportunity to become self-funding. At the beginning of July the Council along with the ERYC, the Scarborough & Ryedale Clinical Commissioning Group and the York District Hospitals Trust resolved to revenue guarantee funds to enable the Service to continue for a twelve week trial period. In July the Council resolved to purchase a litter bin for the junction on Mill Lane/Scarborough Crescent footpath. The Council also resolved to renew the Skate Park Maintenance & the Website Consultant Contracts for a further twelve months.

The Trial pay for use Hospital shuttle transport was launched with many Town Councillors in attendance in the hope that the service would be able to be able to be retained. The Town Council were very impressed with how the hospital transport issues had been dealt with by the Officer in Transport Services and resolved to write a letter of commendation for Mr David Boden for his exceptional services with the matter.

Following the resignation of the sitting Bridlington Town Council Town Crier at the Full Council meeting in July the Town Council resolved not to have a Town Crier for the Council and to make use of established Criers from within the East Riding area when the

need arose. The Town Council responded to the principal authorities Library Consultation with a collated list of issues and comments it wished to convey regarding the proposals with the Council opposing any form of closure at either site. July saw the Town Council approve in principle the implementation of a Mayor's Cadet.

August is normally a recess month for the Town Council but the Mayor and many Town Councillors attended events including the Yorkshire Day flag raising, the Merchant Navy Day and the Blessing of the Gansey Girl Statue on the Bridlington Harbour.

In September the Council received the half year audited annual return with no matters arising. The small grants were awarded to local groups and organisations which totalled £4100. At the September Full Council meeting the Town Council presented the winners of the 2016 Business in Bloom Awards which saw First Place go to Mr & Mrs Thompson of Marshall Lodge, Second Place to Mr Halliday of Alexandra Complex and Third Place to Mr & Mrs Odey of Grantlea Guest House. In September the Town Council resolved to make use of Twitter and Facebook by setting up accounts that are predominantly used as "noticeboards" only. The office staff would manage the updating of both the accounts on a regular basis.

At the October Full Council meeting the Town Council pledged support for an extension to the hospital shuttle bus service for it to continue to the end of January 2017. Mrs King the Town Clerk was presented with a bouquet of flowers to mark her ten years' service with the Town Council. The Town Council resolved to introduce a Full Council meeting in the month of August to alleviate the business meeting during September.

In October the Town Council successfully nominated the Alexandra Bowling Club in Bridlington as an Asset of Community Value. The Town Council resolved to support the Yorkshire Belle's 70th Birthday celebrations in 2017 and to present the Yorkshire Belle with a suitable gift to mark the occasion. Also in October the Town Council resolved to have a working group to select nominations for the Chairman's Awards. There were seven submissions which provided three nominations to be shortlisted at the event in May 2017.

In November the Town Council organised the Remembrance Day event with the Royal British Legion in Bridlington for the first time and many Councillors attended all the Remembrance events over that weekend. The Town Council resolved to financially support the proposal and proceed with organising the implementation of a Veterans' Memorial Stone in the Bridlington War Memorial Gardens. The Town Clerk and the Responsible Financial Officer attended the ERNLLCA Conference in Hull. The Town Council resolved to contact the principal authority regarding tree works schedules in Bridlington as there were concerns. The Operations Manager at the principal authority met with a select number of Councillors and together they undertook site visits in November in Bridlington which proved very productive.

In December the majority of the Town Council Councillors attended many events including the Town Council's Christmas Event along with the Ice Rink opening. The Council resolved to apply for the Local Council Award Scheme Accreditation Quality Award.

In January the Council paid their respects to Mr Barry Moody MBE and Mr Ray Brunning who had done so very much for the area and the Town. Inspector Cocker briefed the Town Council at the Full Council meeting of the current issues facing the Humberside

Police Force in the Bridlington area. The Mayor and Councillors thanked the Inspector for the local police work over the festive period. The Council approved the Budget and Precept for 2017-2018. The Council chose a recipient of the Citizen of Honour Award and confirmed the nominations for the ERYC Chairman's Awards for submission.

In February the ERYC Community Led Local Development Team came to brief at the full Council which was very informative and potentially an exciting future prospect for Bridlington and the local area. Some Councillors supported a Mayor's Charity Quiz night which successfully raised over £200. The Council submitted the Local Council Award Scheme which confirmed that all measures are in place for the Council to achieve Quality Status, once it had been assessed.

In March the Council was pleased to present the Citizen of Honour Award to Mrs Pauline Gibson who has worked tirelessly in many different roles with the Bridlington Rangers Football Club since its formation over 39 years ago.

The Skatepark Coordinator, Mrs Wardle, also attended the Full Council meeting in March to brief about the skatepark and the future plans with regards to the imminent commencement of Skate Club and a Jamiversary event scheduled in the summer.

The Council awarded the second of the bi-annual small grants awards which saw many local groups and organisations receive a cumulative total of over £2760.00. The Yorkshire Belle also received a sponsorship towards its 70th Anniversary Event in May 2017. Most of the female contingent of the Councillors attended the Women's World Day of Prayer and almost all Bridlington Town Councillors attended the raising of the Commonwealth Flag in Southcliffe Gardens.

In April the Council received a brief from the Partnerships and Participations Strategy with regards to the Bridlington Youth Coalition and how collectively making use of shared resources, it is hoped that, a difference can be made in Bridlington. In April the Council collated and published a list of defibrillator locations in Bridlington, specifically listing the community ones that have access 24/7 via contact with the Emergency Services. Some Bridlington Town Councillors attended a food tasting event arranged by the NHS to showcase the standard of the food at Bridlington Hospital. The Council supported the Arts Festival Committee by providing them with a grant of £1500. The Town Council resolved to secure a free toilet provision in the North of Bridlington by paying the Sewerby Cricket Club to open their facilities to the public. The Town Council officially launched the Bridlington Business in Bloom Competition for 2017.

Bridlington Town Council - Small Grants Policy

It is a prime objective of the Council to promote a vibrant community spirit.

This is done in various ways, including small grants to local groups. This policy is designed to help and guide local clubs, societies and organisations making applications for small grants to Bridlington Town Council. The Council will award maximum grants of £500 to an organisation.

- (1)** The Council will only support activities that benefit Bridlington and its residents and the value of the grant is commensurate with the benefit derived (in accordance with Schedule 12 of the Local Government Act 1972).
- (2)** Awards will be considered to help towards:-
 - (a)** Capital cost of new or improved facilities or equipment;
 - (b)** Providing a community service;
 - (c)** Initial funding for new activities
 - (d)** Running costs and organisation of events
- (3)** Grant Awards are not available to individuals or businesses.
- (4)** The Council will not award grants to religious or educational establishments, unless the grant is towards improving activities for the wider community.

All Grants

- (5)** Applications must be made on the attached form.
- (6)** It is a condition of an offer of a grant award that acknowledgement is made by the body or organisation in some way such as in its literature, posters or programmes. This should be in the form of a statement "*Supported by Bridlington Town Council*" or similar.
- (7)** The maximum amount of small grants awards available to an organisation is £500.00 per year. (1st April to 31st March).
- (8)** The Council will need to review how grants awards have been spent and will require evidence to be provided to the Bridlington Town Council office by six months after the awards presentation. The Council may allow an extension to this six month period should it be satisfied of the reason. Any funds not spent for the purposes they were given must be promptly returned to the Council.
- (9)** All grants must be supported by the relevant financial statements (e.g. Bank Statement, Balance Sheet/Income and Expenditure Record) or a written statement of reasons that such information is not available.

Newsletter Committee Report:

Summer 2016 saw the arrival of new Civic Heads of Bridlington Town Council and this formed the front page of the newsletter with the former Mayor's Charity cheque presentation to the Yorkshire Air Ambulance.

Inside this edition the residents were informed about the presentation by the Town Council of coins to Bridlington primary school children to commemorate the Queen's 90th birthday. The Town Council also launched the annual Business in Bloom Competition. There was also a consultation on polling cards to allow residents to have their say. The Newsletter also reported on a new Councillor and the departure of the Civic and Administrative Officer.

The Autumn newsletter distributed to around 17,500 homes advertised the Christmas Events in partnership with Yorkshire Coast Radio, The Spa Bridlington, Bridlington Lions and the Mayor's charities. The front cover featured the Bridlington Town Council Civic Service and an invite to organisations to take part in the Bridlington Remembrance Service now run by Bridlington Town Council. Inside this edition we featured the Bridlington Business In Bloom 2016 winner and invited residents to take part in the Christmas Window Display Competition 2016, the Mayor of Bridlington's Christmas card competition 2016 and to nominate a Citizen of Honour.

In January, Bridlington Town Council distributed its community newsletter which mainly featured the Bridlington Christmas Events and the ice skating rink. Residents were invited to the 'Fly a flag for Commonwealth' event and to apply for small grants.

The year's final newsletter featured The Tour de Yorkshire decorating initiative in partnership with the Bridlington Tourism Association. Whilst Bridlington Town Council is consulted on all applications within Bridlington, the views and recommendations are not always adhered to as the final decisions rest with the Planning Department at the East Riding of Yorkshire Council.

Finance & General Purposes Committee Report:

The Council has had a busy year with a number of projects being undertaken. In April, sixty one spring hanging baskets were provided, once again, to enhance the town. The partnership with East Riding of Yorkshire Council, in the provision of litter bins, has continued for another year to continue to address resident requests and concerns. The Council has continued to maintain the public conveniences provision on St John's Street and has also provided financial support to enable the Sewerby Cricket Club to offer a public conveniences provision during the summer season.

The Council was an active partner in the Shuttle Bus service review and provided financial support for the trial periods. The Council was disappointed that unfortunately the service proved to no longer be viable.

The Council was pleased be able to continue to provide the popular skate club tuition sessions, at the Gasworx Skate Park, throughout the summer season.

The Council was happy to be able to continue to offer the small grants scheme to support many local valued community groups. The small grants policy has been reviewed to ensure that it continues to be fit for purpose, to support as many local groups and be as inclusive as possible.

November saw the Council looking to the next financial year with the consideration and setting of budgets and precept. The Council reviewed all areas, noting that an increase would be necessary to address unavoidable rising costs. The precept has seen a 10.51% increase this year due to the ongoing increased costs and also to safeguard support for community projects and events.

Christmas pomanders were once again provided to enhance the town, during the festive period, and the ice rink returned for another year. The Mayor's Christmas Card Competition was as popular as ever with prizes being provided to the winners by Bridlington Town Council and Bridlington Spa.

The Council has approved the purchase of a Veterans Memorial Stone to honour all Veterans and looks forward to completion of this project in the near future. The Council also looks forward to the 70th Anniversary of the Yorkshire Belle and was pleased to provide sponsorship towards this event.

I would like to thank all the members of the Finance and General Purposes Committee for their commitment and active participation in meetings throughout the year. On behalf of the committee I would also like to thank Victoria Exon – Responsible Financial Officer for her support and assistance throughout the year.

Skatepark Coordinator Report:

We provide a challenging sporting environment for children and young adults (who aren't attracted to traditional team sports) a place to go and express themselves in an individual and athletic manner. Getting children, particularly those at-risk involved in a personal and esteem-building activity like skateboarding/riding helps them build the confidence to do well in other aspects of their lives.

The coordinator is a point of contact for anyone who may have concerns about the park or require advice e.g. skatepark etiquette, accompanying younger children etc.

Unfortunately the summer Skatejam was impossible to arrange this year due to a period of ill health and availability of volunteers and equipment however the summer 2017 jam date has already been publicised.

Maintenance – the coordinator ensures the grass is cut fortnightly throughout the growing season. The park is cleaned daily (apart from Christmas Day) and the skip is emptied as required. Any incidents are followed up with meetings with CCTV/police as appropriate e.g. skip fire, damage to MUGA, bin fire. Offensive graffiti is removed from the park as and when required. A daily written inspection is carried out and an annual report is commissioned by an external risk assessment agency.

The brush box (funded with an external grant) is kept replenished with tools and responsible older park users have the combination so are able to take some ownership in the cleaning of the park, setting a good example to younger riders.

Skate Lessons

Free weekly lessons are held on a Friday 4-5pm for beginners and 5-6pm for intermediate, at the skatepark when the weather is dry from April to September. Extra lessons are planned for the holidays which have been well attended. The numbers of those attending are documented on the monthly reports. The lessons encourage less confident and new skaters to use the park and parents to stay which promotes the park in a positive way. It's a safe environment for local youth to meet, socialise, and develop friendships based on a common, healthy interest. The sessions are delivered with Active Skateboarding and all adults involved are DBS checked and are trained in first aid and child safeguarding.

The Skateclub no longer holds the ERYCVS quality assurance awards for Sports Groups in the East Riding as it was funded through Youth Services who have pulled the funding.

The lessons provide opportunities to

- Promote healthy lifestyles and the wellbeing of young people
- Develop a network of positive and approachable role models who encourage and promote the use of the skatepark in a friendly and positive way
- Deliver regular coaching sessions
- Increase the numbers of parents, children and young people using the park

- Provide relevant information for young people around healthy lifestyles and wellbeing by signposting them to external agencies

Media

Press releases and positive stories have been documented in the local press. There is a Facebook page that provides information on the skatepark and up to date information is included on the Bridlington Town Council webpage.

This all helps to influence wider public perceptions and provide a balance to negative media coverage.

Baseline Information and Evidence of Need

The range and extent of challenges faced by children and young people is growing, as the financial means by which statutory organisation can support them diminishes due to the economic climate. The skatepark is open access and the skate lessons are free – we are open to all. Equipment is low cost and readily available second hand.

Childhood obesity is an increasing concern within the East Riding; with 18% of Year 6 pupils being classified as obese according to their Body Mass Index. High levels of childhood obesity are likely to lead to an increase in a wide range of chronic and acute health conditions, such as diabetes, coronary heart disease, respiratory problems, certain cancers and reduced quality of life.

A meaningful and influential relationship with a coach encourages children to seek out other beneficial mentorships in their life. Structured sport sessions provide the opportunity to build new friendships (children attend from across a cluster of schools) and learn how to manage own behaviour in a social and group environment and helps children learn conflict resolution.

Mastering tricks and skills provides the opportunity to teach children how to handle disappointment, competition, frustration and anger. Modelling positive behaviour by coaching encourages young people to use the same tools to solve conflict in other areas of their lives and develop positive interactions with other adults.

Children who are involved in sporting activity at a young age are more likely to stay active in later life.

We engage with the wider community - the co-ordinator has met with the youth service and local schools and now attends the new Youth Coalition meetings.

Of the 44 documented skateboarding fatalities in 2015 - all were on roads – and none in a skatepark, it is important to provide somewhere safe for people to skate.
