BRIDLINGTON TOWN COUNCIL BUSINESS IN BLOOM COMPETITION LAUNCH



Bridlington Town Council are happy to launch this year's Bridlington Business in Bloom Competition, which is the annual competition to reward a business in Bridlington that shows exceptional dedication to display floral enhancements to their business premises. The Town Council hopes by running this award it encourages the businesses to make their premises look lovely which will have a positive knock on effect for Bridlington.

The winner, chosen by the Bridlington in Bloom Committee, will be awarded with an engraved cup and a Bridlington Town Council plaque. The plaque will be retained as a memento of their success and the cup will be returned to be presented to the winner of the next year's competition.

Closing date for this year's competition will be 5th August 2018. Judging will take place the following week with the winners being presented their awards at the Full Council meeting on Wednesday 19th September 2018.

BRIDLINGTON TOILET PROVISION BY BRIDLINGTON TOWN COUNCIL



The majority of toilets in Bridlington are managed by the principal authority, the East Riding of Yorkshire Council. The Bridlington Town Council manage a provision in Bridlington Old Town which is a toilet block at the end of the High Street as there is no other provision in this area of Bridlington. During the winter month's people can make use of toilets in Sewerby Hall for free however during the summer months there is no access to the toilets unless you are visiting Sewerby Hall. The Town Council recognise the lack of provision in this area during the summer months and pay for a free public toilet provision at the Sewerby Cricket Club. This enables the Sewerby Cricket Club to provide their facilities during the summer months for free to the public opening 9.30 – 4.30 every day. The Bridlington Town Council would like to thank the Sewerby Cricket Club for being able to accommodate this arrangement for the summer.

FREE - SKATEBOARDING LESSONS AT THE SKATEPARK

During the summer months the Town Council provides free skateboarding lessons on Friday evenings term time 4pm – 6pm at Gasworx Skatepark. The first session 4pm to 5pm is for beginners and 5pm to 6pm for intermediate skateboarders. Lessons are led by Mr Paul Regan of Active Skateboarding, equipment can be provided and sessions are suitable from age 5 upwards. Kay Wardle the coordinator explained: "The lessons encourage young people to learn to take turns, share a space, face new challenges publicly, and pick themselves (or others up) after a fall. Getting children involved in a personal and esteem-building activity like skateboarding helps them build the confidence to do well in other aspects of their lives."

Lessons and Skate Jams are also run in the school holidays. Dates and details will be listed on the Bridlington Town Council website and the Gasworx Facebook page as and when events are organised. As the Gasworx is an open, unsupervised facility, we encourage younger park users to avoid the facility at busy times, to be accompanied by an adult and all users to ride within their own ability and wear appropriate safety equipment.
