## Bridlington Town Council Re-Location & Community Hub

The Bridlington Town Council is very happy to announce that it has now purchased the earmarked property on Marshall Avenue. The centrally located building will provide the Town with some viable versatile community space upstairs and Town Council office space downstairs.

The original price of the building was £265,000 and the Town Council have paid £175,000 which was the valuation price of the building. The refurbishment will take place in two stages; the downstairs office space will be commenced immediately and due to ensuring the requirements and needs of the Community Hub are completely met this element will be undertaken at a later stage with funding.

Not owning any other properties the Town Council hopes that the work undertaken on this former Chapel in the Town centre will secure the future of a building in need of renovation, enhance the local area and provide a well needed asset to the Town. Bridlington Town Council is currently working closely with East Riding Voluntary Action Services (ERVAS), members of the Bridlington Youth Coalition and local charities to source additional funding to ensure that the cost to the public is minimised and that services provided will be of maximum benefit to the whole of the Bridlington community.

It is envisaged that the Community Hub will be open at least 5 days a week and will include an informal community space, training and educational space, employment, volunteering and apprenticeship opportunities, a café, a range of drop in services, along with meeting spaces and offices available for other local services, small businesses and community groups to use.

The Headlands community event will run all day and will involve cycling and various lengths of runs in the morning and into the afternoon. This is set to be a very exciting day in Bridlington.

## Summary of Precept Bridlington Town Council Financial Year - 2019/2020

Each year Bridlington Town Council is obliged to produce a budget to cover its operational costs. The Town Council requests the East Riding of Yorkshire Council to levy a charge on every domestic property within the three Bridlington wards. This charge is known as the Precept and the cost to each household is dependent upon the Council Tax Band that the property falls into. The bands range from 'A' to 'H' and the Town Council's 2019/2020 Precept ranges from 26p per week for an 'A' band property to 79p per week for a 'H' band property. For more details of the breakdown of services and costs included within the Town Council's Precept please see the reverse of this leaflet. The Precept has seen a 3.67% increase this year. However, due to the increased tax base the bands 'A' to 'H' amounts will only see a 1.99% increase this financial year.
