**Minutes of the Council Meeting held on 5th July 2016**

**RESOLVED:** *Apologies were received and accepted from Councillors B Croft, Holmes & Marsburg.*

**69.16** The Council considered the updated information provided by Mr David Boden Manager from Transport Services at the East Riding Yorkshire Council regarding the funding for the hospital shuttle bus and how Holderness Rural Transport Services are able to deliver this trial period service:

**RESOLVED:** *The Town Council resolved to revenue guarantee a sum of £4,000 (four thousand pounds) to enable the hospital shuttle bus service to continue for a 12 week paid for trial period. The York District Hospitals Trust, the Scarborough & Ryedale Clinical Commissioning Group and the East Riding of Yorkshire Council are all providing revenue guarantees to ensure the trial period can take place.*

*The Council further resolved to release an immediate press release regarding;*

*"The Bridlington Town Council is pleased to be working positively with the York District Hospitals Trust, Scarborough & Ryedale Clinical Commissioning Group and the East Riding of Yorkshire Council who have all agreed to revenue guarantee a 12 week trial paid for hospital bus service to enable the service to be given the opportunity to investigate whether a paid service could be permanently retained. The Town Council are very disappointed that the East Riding Clinical Commissioning Group has refused to allocate any funding to revenue guarantee the trial service and resolved to contact that organisation to convey the Council's disappointment considering the importance of this service to the Area. The Town Council would like to thank Mr David Boden from the East Riding of Yorkshire Council's Transport Services Department for his work with this important matter".*
