### Minutes (subject to confirmation) of the PARISH MEETING held on 2nd May 2012 in the Council Chamber at the Town Hall, Bridlington

**Present:** Councillors R Allerston, J Carder, L Chambers, M Charlesworth, J Copsey, L Dealtry, T Dixon, S Finlay, J Foster, and C Marsburg (presided) a total of ten present (10).  
Three (3) local electors were in attendance.  
Mrs King recorded the minutes.

**1. Welcome by the Mayor:**

Councillor C Marsburg welcomed everyone to the Parish Meeting.

**2. Apologies for absence:**

Apologies for absence were received and accepted from Councillors D Metcalf & M Milns.

**3. Approval of the minutes of the Parish Meeting held on 13th April 2011:**

**5. Questions received in writing:**

Mr Orgine posed the following question:-

Q. Mr Orgine wished to know why his address had not received any Bridlington Town Council newsletters and explained how easily accessible his building is for the receipt of any mail. He informed the Council that many people he knew had also not received a Council Newsletter. Mr Orgine informed that he considered that distribution of the newsletter would benefit being made available in public buildings throughout the town and listed a number of East Riding of Yorkshire Council venues and doctors surgeries.

A. The Mayor informed Mr Orgine that the Council employed a distributor who had been asked to investigate the matter and the Mayor read out the comprehensive response to Mr Orgine which included that if Mr Orgine wished the distributor would ensure delivery to his address would happen on a regular basis. Councillor Finlay added that the newsletter was available in the Councils Offices and in Community Centres in the Town and that the Council is required to produce a newsletter for working towards Quality Status. Mrs King added that the all the newsletters are available on-line via the Town Council's website.

**6. Questions from the floor:**

Mr Ashby:

Q. Mr Ashby considered that the Town Hall Council Chamber was in a poor state of repair and that neither of the clocks have been in working order for some time and that considering it is a Listed Building that this was unacceptable. Mr Ashby is aware that the Town Hall falls under the jurisdiction of the East Riding of Yorkshire Council.

- A. The Mayor informed that it was not a matter for the Town Council and would imagine that the maintenance would be costly.
