QUEENS DIAMOND JUBILEE

To mark 60 years of the Queen's reign the Diamond Jubilee will take place in 2012. The celebrations will centre around an extended weekend in 2012 on 2, 3, 4 and 5 June. To mark this milestone in this country's history we would like as a Town Council and Town to celebrate Her Majesties Golden Jubilee. For this unique occasion we would like to hold a street party in the grounds of Bridlington's Town Hall and are asking the residents for their support with this initiative.



WIND TURBINES

The Council has been approached by representatives of Fraisthorpe, who are concerned that the proposed eleven large wind turbines will have detrimental effect on the area. It is understood that the turbines will be larger than those already in place at Lisset and much nearer the town. Permission has already been granted for a test rig. The Council will take protesters views into consideration on all wind turbine planning matters.

The ERYC has declined to include the movement of the funfair in the Area Action Plan. The Council will present its case to the independent Public Inquiry Inspector in December and depend on her recommendation.

Bridlington Town Council has agreed to take over some of the initiatives and activities of the Bridlington In Bloom Committee, following the decision to disband at the end of 2011, due to the lack of new members. It is early days and the Town Council will be seeking further information on how we can move this forward from the regional office of the Royal Horticultural Society. The Council would like to enter the Bridlington in Bloom competition but it would need a commitment from local businesses to be able to do so.
