Minutes of the Environment Committee Held on 18th March 2024
in the Bridlington Town Council Offices, 2A Marshall Avenue, Bridlington 12 noon

A meeting was held with six (6) Councillors Heslop-Mullens, C Marsburg, R Pollard, C Verda (Chair), Andy Walker and Angie Walker

35.23 Apologies for Absence:

The committee resolved to contact East Riding of Yorkshire Council to enquire if funding can be utilised to purchase these trees, to support the Childrens' ongoing efforts, with the council then being able to plant in appropriate locations. The committee also resolved to contact Humber Forest to discuss with them the possibility of utilising these trees as a local source. A third resolution was made to write to Mr Clark at Burlington School to congratulate them on all their efforts on this fantastic project.*
